* Grants to Combat Violence Against Women are not authorized as a distinct category in VAWA. Rather, STOP Grants are authorized at \$225 million and Transitional Housing is authorized as its own line item for \$40 million. However, Congress traditionally appropriates an amount for Grants to Combat VAW and then deducts earmarks from it, leaving the remainder for STOP grants. These earmarks, including the separately authorized Transitional Housing program, reduce the funding available for STOP formula grants to states. From FY '03 to FY '06, funding for STOP grants was cut by \$17.6 million due to earmarks. In the final FY '07 budget, STOP grants received an increase because the Native American/Native Alaskan Liaison Office earmark was removed. For FY '08 the earmark was reinstated, cutting STOP grants by an additional \$2.8 million.

± These programs provide valuable services and training. They should be authorized and funded in other areas of DOJ.

** Each year, a small rescission (usually under 1%) is taken off of each discretionary program in the Budget. For FY '08, no rescission was applied to DOJ programs but LHHS programs were subjected to a rescission of 1.74%. The large LHHS rescission cuts significantly more money from FVPSA, RPE, DELTA and the NDVH than in years past. Therefore, programs that appear to have received level funding in the LHHS budget actually received a cut, when the rescission is calculated. After rescission, FVPSA is funded at \$122.6 million, the National Domestic Violence Hotline is funded at \$2.918 million, RPE is funded at \$42.1 million, and Community Initiatives to Prevent Abuse (DELTA) was funded at \$5.1 million. **This brings the actual total of LHHS programs to a reduced \$172.7 million, with \$3 million in cuts.**

° While there was no rescission applied to FY '08 CJS funding, a rescission was applied to the Office of Violence Against Women to seize yet unspent funds and give them to the Treasury. **This rescission totaled \$14.7 million.**
